

The Leaning tower of Pisa


- Bell Tower of the Pisa cathedral in Pisa, Italy

• PSALM 127:1


'Unless the Lord builds a house, the work of the builders is wasted.' NLT

Ministry Principles from these verses


We must teach and pass on our faith to the generations that follow us
