




Resource (n): "a stock or supply of money, materials, staff, and other assets that can be drawn on by a person or organization in order to function effectively."

- **Pew Research**, "Second-Generation Americans: A Portrait of the Adult Children of Immigrants" (2013)
 - 2nd generations:
 - "...are substantially better off than [the first generation] immigrants...on key measures of socioeconomic attainment..."
 - "...[have] characteristics [that] resemble those of the full US/[Canada] adult population."

Comparing Immigrants, the Second Generation and All U.S. Adults







Compared to first generation immigrants, **2nd generations** are much *more likely* to:

- "speak English;" (be comfortable with English)
- "...have friends and spouses outside their ethnic or racial group..."
- "...say their group gets along well with others..."
- "...think of themselves as a "typical American."



Compared to <u>the general American public</u>, 2nd generations are much more likely:

- "...to place more importance...on hard work and career success."
- "...[to be] more inclined to call themselves Liberal/[Democrats] and less likely to identify as [Conservatives]/Republicans."
- "...for the most part to say their standard of living is higher than that of their parents at the same stage of life."

"In all of these measures, the second generation resembles the **immigrant generation** more closely than the general public."



Immigrant population > American public

American public > Immigrant population

- More importance on hard work and career success
- More likely to identify as liberals than as Republicans
- Higher standard of living than their parents at the same stage of life

- Higher socioeconomic attainment
- Likely to speak English
- Have friends and spouse outside their ethnic group

- Higher standard of living than their parents at the same stage of life



- Come close to [YaYA] in [genuine]
 friendships and service
- Invite them to your home
- Come close to [YaYA] individually with Christlike sympathy
- Seek to awaken their interest in the great things of eternal life
- Know their interest(s) & skill(s) and bond with them on them





- Introduce YaYA to spiritual truth(s)
- Help YaYA to come to know, and fall in love Jesus
 - Family Devotions, PF, Sabbath School,
 Songs, Vespers, Camps etc.
- Challenge them to be resourceful, biblically





- Longest and most labor intensive
- Cultivate their interests, skills, talents, resources etc.
- Teach, mentor, coach, learn from them while they also learn from you
- Challenge them, give them opportunities to grow and apply their skills
- Failure is part of cultivation, embrace and let them learn from them





- Inviting them out to commit systematically and consistently to a ministry (already existing or starting one depending on their interest and skills)
- Depending on the the personal preference, some may commit to something outward facing or in the background
- Note: Some may minister at your local church or at another local church - which is ok. (MDP, AF, ReGen, Shiloh...)
- Anywhere they see God's call for them to be systematic and consistent





- PRESERVE the harvest through intentional and systematic discipleship after initial commitment
- Nurture new resourceful YaYA and train them to engage in making other resourceful YaYA
- The consumer must become a producer.
 The receiver must become a giver
- Jesus said to them, 'Follow Me, and I will make you become fishers of men (Mark 1:17)
