

We Can Never Ful Understand God

• We can never we have any single thing about God.

- His greatness (Ps. 145:3),
- His understanding (Ps. 147:5),
- His knowledge (Ps. 139:6),
- His riches, wisdom, judgments, and ways (Rom. 11:33) are all beyond our ability to understand fully.
- His ways and thoughts (Isa. 55:9)
- His acts (Job 26:14; cf. 11:7-9; 37:5).

God is Incomprehensibl but Knowable Jesus' statement: "And this is lie eternal, that they should know Thee, the only true God, and Him whom thou didst send, even Jesus Christ," John 17:3.

 We have understanding through Jesus: "the Son of God is come, and hath given us an understanding, that we know Him that is true, and we are in Him that is true, even in His Son Jesus Christ." I John 5:20. Christ was not simply speaking of gaining an entrance into heaven, but of knowing and experiencing an elemal quality of life now, a life of meaning, purpose, and usefulness to God and humanity with peace and joy. We do not know what God is in His essential Being (quid), but can know something of His nature, of what He is to us, as He reveals Himself in His divine children (qualis).

God Can Truly Be Known

 Through Scripture, we can know irue things about God:

- It is true to say that God is love (1 John 4:8),
- that God is light (1 John 1:5),
- that God is spirit (John 4:24),
- that God is just or righteous (Rom. 3:26).



 Several biblical passages speak of our knowing God himself.

- Knowing God is the foundation of our joy and sense of worth (Jer. 9:23–24).
- Knowing God is life (John 17:3),
- Knowing God is promised in the new covenant (Heb. 8:11),
- We have an understanding of God through the Son (1 John 5:20; see also Gal. 4:9; Phil. 3:10; 1 John 2:3, 13; 4:8).



The Christian life includes a personal relationship with God.

- We speak to God in prayer, and He speaks to us through His Word.
- We commune with Him in his presence,
- We sing His praise,
- we are aware that He personally dwells among us and within us to bless us (John 14:23).
- This personal relationship with God the Father, with God the Son, and with God, the Holy Spirit may be said to be the greatest of all the blessings of the Christian life (Rev 3:20)

God's Self-Disclosure



- Self-Revelation: God Communicates Knowledge of Himself to humanity: I Cor. 2:11.
- Innate and Acquired Knowledge of God (Psa 139:14)
- General Revelation (Psa 19)

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Revelation is always God in action, God speaking, bringing something entirely new to humanity, something of which they could have no previous knowledge, and which becomes a real revelation only for those who accept the object of revelation by a God-given faith Although we cannot fully know everything about God, since he has chosen to reveal himself to his creatures in a variety of ways we can know him personally, meaningfully, and significantly, in a limited, true but ever-increasing way throughout eternity.
